2	STATING FINDINGS OF THE LEGISLATURE AND AFFIRMING THE LEGISLATURE'S OPPOSI-
3	TION TO THE LEGALIZATION OF MARIJUANA IN IDAHO.
4	Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:
5	WHEREAS, marijuana is classified as a Schedule I controlled substance
6	under both state and federal law and has a negative impact on public health
7	and safety; and
8	WHEREAS, the tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) content of marijuana has risen
9	dramatically in the last 30 years, contributing to the fact that one out of
10	six teenagers who start smoking marijuana will become addicted to it; and
11	WHEREAS, marijuana use has a detrimental effect on individual learning
12	and brain development; and
13	WHEREAS, national pro-marijuana organizations have invested millions
14	to push drug legalization in America, and have targeted Idaho for a "medical"
15	marijuana initiative in 2014; and
16	<pre>WHEREAS, drug legalization efforts in other states have led to social,</pre>
17	economic and legal chaos, with programs full of fraud and abuse; and
18	WHEREAS, drug legalization laws in neighboring states have already ad-
19	versely impacted Idaho through cultural acceptance of drug use that reduces
20	the perception of harm among children and increases drug use; and
21	WHEREAS, increased drug use will impact public education in Idaho, pro-
22	ductivity in the workplace, escalate the number of impaired drivers on Idaho
23	roads, and affect other areas of our lives; and
24	WHEREAS, the people of Idaho have a strong tradition of prevention ef-
25	forts through public education, sound public policies and laws pertaining to
26	substance abuse.
